Suspension of Student's Driving Privileges

1. If a request is made to the Oregon Department of Transportation (ODOT) to suspend or deny a student's driving privileges, the following requirements will be met:
 - a. The superintendent will meet with the parent, either by phone or in person, or if the parent is not available by phone or can't or won't attend a meeting, a registered and regular letter will be mailed before submitting a request to ODOT;
 - b. The request to ODOT will be in writing, copy to parent(s);
 - c. The student involved is at least 15 years of age;
 - d. The student has been expelled for bringing a weapon on school property; or
 - e. The student has been suspended or expelled at least twice, singularly or in combination, for any of the following reasons:
 1. Assaulting or menacing a school employee or another student;
 2. Willful damage or injury to district property;
 3. Use of threats, intimidation, harassment or coercion against a school employee or another student.
 4. Possessing, using or delivering any controlled substance or being under the influence of any controlled substance at a school or on school property or at school sponsored activity, function or event.
 - f. The requested time period during which a student may see his/her driving privileges denied shall not be for more than one year unless the superintendent is filing a second written request on the same student. A second written request may request suspension of the student's driving privileges until the student reaches 21 years of age;
 - g. The student has a right to appeal the superintendent's decision through the district suspension/expulsion appeal procedure.
2. Once a student who has reached 15 years of age or more and has 10 consecutive days of unexcused absences or 15 school days total unexcused absences during a single semester or has withdrawn or dropped from school, the principal is to request that the superintendent notify the ODOT of the student's status. When Notice of Withdrawal (DMV form 735-72186) is received, ODOT shall notify the student that driving privileges will be suspended on the 30th day following the date of the notice unless the student has provided proof that he/she has graduated from high school or obtained a GED certificate.
